

# Annual meeting of the PAPFor steering committee

The Regional Programme Steering Committee held its annual meeting on 25 October 2023 to review progress and plan for 2024. This third session of the steering committee was attended by almost 50 participants who reviewed progress and results against the indicators in the PAPFor funding agreement. The meeting benefited from a presentation by BirdLife International and RSPB on activities in the Gola Foya Landscape, and a second by Nature Plus on a reference document it is preparing with PAPFor's regional coordination team on the state of Guinean forests and the main forest protected areas in West Africa.





Agreement on "call to action" to prevent deforestation caused by cocoa farming

#### Conservation Society completes conservation planning in Sierra Leone's Gola Forest

After three years of consultation, the Conservation Society of Sierra Leone (CSSL) has successfully completed land-use planning and mapping of all community forests around the Gola Rainforest National Park in Sierra Leone. In developing strategies to mitigate threats to the ecosystem and mapping the land management of the landscape, the CSSL held a series of workshops and qualitative interviews with communities in each locality.

## Duikers

Guinea's forests are home to no fewer than nine species of duiker, a genus of small forest antelope, four of which are endemic. Varying enormously in size, they weigh between 5 kg and 80 kg depending on the species. Duikers control the composition of the undergrowth and are important disseminators of trees by eating their ripe fruit that has fallen to the ground.
